# From the Loft

You Are Near, Here I am, Lord, These Alone Are Enough — Dan Schutte's music has been part of the heartbeat for the Church for more than 50 years. Some of his most celebrated songs, such as City of God and Sing a New Song, are from his years of collaboration with the St. Louis Jesuits. One of my favorite Advent hymns, Beyond the Moon and Stars, also composed by Schutte, fills my soul with joyful memories of past preparations for the birth of Jesus right here at Blessed Trinity. This piece expresses the very heart of the Advent season: "So great our hunger, Lord, to see your light." It refers to that deep-down ache that we feel in our souls, like a hunger that is never really satisfied. The verses very clearly point forward to the Christmas season with allusions to the journey of the Magi seeking the light of God's star. Chances are good you will hear it again during the Christmas season - it is just that beautiful.
