You have heard our choir sing 8th century chant, gospel songs, four-part arrangements of the classic choral repertoire, songs in other languages, and contemporary Christian music. We sing with organ, piano, guitar, violin, brass choir, handbells, drums, and tambourines. We sing the old favorites and try new ways of praising God on a weekly basis. The recurring theme of our music is that it is offered with love to our Creator and our Parish to the very best of our abilities. We are not homogeneous or boring in our musical worship, and, with the inclusion of three equally diverse parishes in our growing family, the potential for growth, tolerance, and praise will only increase.
