#### The Epiphany of the Lord

First Reading Isaiah 60:1-6 (20ABC)

#### <u>Do You Hear What I Hear? Do</u> <u>You See What I See? Taste,</u> <u>Touch, Smell.....</u>

We probably all somewhat take for granted our five senses until they



become compromised in some way. For me, my eyes are growing tired, I struggle to hear in vacuous spaces. How many of us temporarily lost some taste and smell when suffering from Covid? It makes me so much more appreciative and aware of the God-given gift of our senses in order to be able to intensely experience the world into which we are born. Epiphany simply means a "showing forth," a "revealing," a "manifestation." In the context of our faith, Epiphany is God's showing forth of God's self to us in the flesh, in Jesus His Son. Let us not miss this great opportunity to take in what God reveals through the sense of our hearts where we can hold and ponder it! Let us not take for granted what God has done for us out of Love for us! Let us not miss the opportunity to follow any shining star or light of God's presence anticipating what God desires show us of Himself, His way, truth and light! It's my faith that God wants us to "intensely experience" His world of Love, His Kingdom of Peace and Justice. Like the magi from the east, enlightened, we travel ever forward - in following - taking routes that avoid the ways of darkness and sin and the evil intents of any of the Herods in our current world.

The Christmas Season Officially Ends This Monday with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord - "The manifestation of Christ that we celebrate during Christmas Time culminates in the Baptism of the Lord. On the last day of the Christmas season, may we thank of how we will be open to allow Christ to be manifest in our lives. Let us resolve to consciously choose to follow Christ more closely and take seriously our baptismal call to live as disciples... Jesus begins his ministry of servant leadership as he rises from the waters and is affirmed by "the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming upon We are called to mission, by virtue of our baptism, by our actions and attitudes to "consecrate the world itself to God" (Lumen Gentium, 34). On this feast, we accept- once again the responsibility of our baptism, to live in mission to others - even those we might not want to evangelize and welcome - the least the lost, the homeless, the hurting, the refuges, those most vulnerable, those who are different from us in any way. May our evangelization reach to all of God's people, the Gentiles of today, as Christ himself extended the reach of the Good News in his own person." (Sourcebook for

# From the Loft

In 1857, John Henry Hopkins, Jr. assembled an elaborate Christmas pageant, for which he wrote both words and music, for the General Theological Seminary in New York City, where he was an instructor in church music. One of the selections dealt with the Wise Men who came from the East, and, for this part of the pageant, Hopkins created one of America's most beloved carols. The three kings, Melchior, Caspar, and Balthazar, brought: gold (the traditional metal of royalty); frankincense (an aromatic bark whose smoke was thought to reach the gates of heaven); and myrrh (an unguent used in the preparation of bodies for burial). These gifts thus signified Jesus' kingship, His oneness with God, and His eventual death on the cross. I had no idea this carol was born in the USA – how wonderful we are able to share it as our opening hymn for the Epiphany, which marks the end of the Christmas season.

> We three kings of Orient are; Bearing gifts we traverse afar, Field and fountain, moor and mountain, Following yonder star.

Born a King on Bethlehem's plain Gold I bring to crown Him again, King forever, ceasing never, Over us all to reign.

Frankincense to offer have I; Incense owns a Deity nigh; Prayer and praising, voices raising, Worshipping God on high.

Myrrh is mine, its bitter perfume Breathes a life of gathering gloom; Sorrowing, sighing, bleeding, dying, Sealed in the stone cold tomb.

Glorious now behold Him arise; King and God and sacrifice; Alleluia, Alleluia, Sounds through the earth and skies. O star of wonder, star of light, Star with royal beauty bright, Westward leading, still proceeding, Guide us to thy perfect light.

Let us remember to continue to follow this Perfect Light in the weeks and months to come!
