

This Sunday marks the return of the Blessed Trinity Choir after a much-deserved rest following our unusual Christmas season. If the choir sounds even better this week, it is because we have added some new voices to our ranks. We are celebrating our increase in number with a new hymn to BT, composed in 2016 by Curtis Stephan. In less than 15 years, Curtis Stephan has leapfrogged from promising young songwriter to one of the most productive forces in liturgical music today. A lifelong musician, he received his bachelor's in music and his master's in jazz studies from the University of North Texas. He is a parish music director, composer, concert and recording artist and workshop clinician.

Curtis travels the world presenting liturgical training and inspirational music, witnessing to all ages through workshops, retreats, missions, conferences, youth rallies and liturgies. Whether he is teaching the foundational elements of planning music for liturgy, the nuts and bolts of arranging and conducting or leading youth through the sacraments, he has the same goal: helping people connect with God and making disciples Christ. Exploring the themes of Creation, Peace, and Social Concern, as articulated in the papal encyclical Laudato Si', this song, Tend the Ground, has a contemporary sound but a solid hymn-like feel. I believe it will become a future-favorite at Blessed Trinity because we have an innovative choir to lead the congregation in praise.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, On February 28, 2020, The Diocese of Buffalo N.Y., ("Diocese") filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

The Court entered an Order (the "Supplemental Bar Date Order") setting April 17, 2023, at 11:59 P.M. (prevailing Eastern time) (the "Supplemental Bar Date") as the deadline to assert claims against the Diocese arising from or relating to abuse that occurred when the survivor was 18 years of age or older, and which, prior to the enactment of the Adult Survivors Act (S.66A/A.648A) would have been subject to a statute of limitations defense ("Adult Claims").

If you have an Adult Claim against the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Supplemental Bar Date. ANY CLAIM FILED PURSUANT TO THE SUPPLEMENTAL BAR DATE ORDER SHALL BE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO THE RIGHT OF ANY PARTY IN INTEREST TO ASSERT OBJECTIONS TO ANY CLAIM OR ITS TIMELINESS.
